or more than 50 years, OATS Transit has been producing and mailing its publication, *The Wheel*. What initially began with a typewriter, mimeograph machine, and an individual diligently typing out the organization's routes each month has evolved into a colorful marketing piece that is mailed to over 18,000 riders, employees, legislators, donors, supporters, and others. The publication even played a role in the early career of our current Executive Director Dorothy Yeager, who was hired as the editor for the publication in 1987.

After extensive discussions about the readership of the publication, the need to disseminate timely information, and the increasing costs of printing and postage, coupled with a decrease in the number of recipients, the OATS Transit Board has approved transitioning to a digital monthly format beginning in 2025.

This edition marks the final printed version of The Wheel. Starting in January 2025, a monthly digital version will be delivered to your email. Every year, our drivers run thousands of trips to pick up a rider, only to find out for various reasons that they aren't riding, nor did they call ahead to tell us they weren't. This is not just an inconvenience, but a significant cost to our company in terms of time, fuel, and missed opportunities to serve other riders.

Last year alone, we made **53,851** trips or **381,672** unnecessary miles, to pick someone up, only to find out once we got there they weren't riding. These "no-shows" cost us money, but more importantly, funding could have been used to provide a ride for someone else.

We have a strict policy on no-shows and late cancellations, and you need to know the impact this could have on your future trips.

OATS Transit policy is that passengers who establish a pattern or practice of excessive No-Shows or Late Cancellations will be subject to suspension of service.

- A No-Show occurs when a rider fails to appear to board the vehicle for a scheduled trip. This presumes the vehicle arrives at the scheduled pickup location within the pickup window, and the driver waits at least five minutes.
- A Late Cancellation occurs when a rider cancels scheduled service one hour or less before the rider's scheduled pickup window begins.

Any combination of three No-Shows or Late Cancellations in a consecutive 30-day period will be deemed "excessive." Riders with excessive No-Shows or Late Cancellations will be subject to temporary service suspension. The first offense will be 30 days, the second 60 days, and the third 90 days. OATS Transit will charge the funding source a no-show fee that does not exceed half the trip cost.

If you use the OATS Transit app, you can cancel trips through the app. This feature is designed to make trip management easier for you. A tab on the app called no-shows lists those trips, so you can check to see if you have any no shows.

Please help us by doing your part and letting us know ahead of time if you are not going on a scheduled trip so we can give that seat to someone else. This saves us fuel, drivers' time, and places fewer miles on our aging fleet.

We have an App for That!


e have an app for OATS Transit riders to see scheduled trips, track their bus and check their account balances. This app is available in all of the service areas of OATS Transit. The app will <u>not</u> work for those who board at bus stops, such as Kirksville or Sedalia.

To use the app, please follow these directions:

When you call to schedule a trip, provide a valid email address and ask that self-service be turned on for your account. An email will be sent to the rider once their account has been activated.

You will need to download the app through the Google Play Store (Android) or the Apple Store (IOS/iPhone) for free. Once the app has been

downloaded, the rider will need to set up a password. If you forget your password, you will have to use the "Forget Pass-




What the app looks like.

word?" option; our offices cannot reset or tell you what your password is.


On the app, you will see the following information:

On the main page of the app, your name will appear, the balance on your account and the main phone number for OATS.



Under trips, you can see Upcoming, Past & Canceled trips. You can also use this app to cancel trips but remember that OATS Transit needs at least one hour or more to cancel a pre-scheduled trip. Failure to give our organization at least one hour or more will be recorded as a **Late Cancellation** (see story on page 4).

In the sample below, a rider can view where there bus is located, based off when the trip is scheduled. This is referred to as the "Where's My Ride" feature.



Even if you do not want to use the app, we would appreciate it if you would provide us with an email address, so we can send you news regarding OATS Transit.

Just a Reminder:

This app cannot be used for riders who use bus or flag stops in Kirksville, Arnold, Sedalia, etc. This app is for riders who **pre-schedule** their trips.

Serving Veterans Through Rides & Employment

ew groups deserve our recognition, respect, and gratitude more than the brave men and women

who have served in the military. These individuals and their families have made tremendous sacrifices so we can preserve our way of life. This Veterans Day, we sincerely thank and appreciate veterans who have served so selflessly and courageously.

OATS Transit is proud to say that 19% of our employees are veterans, and two of our OATS Transit Board of Directors are veterans. We serve more than 400 riders who are veterans across our service territory and are appreciative of those who help us connect and support this group of riders. Our organization is fortunate to have received funding and support through several foundations that recognize the value of our services and how the

services help veterans get to medical appointments.

"I live in Columbia and noticed the OATS Transit buses seemed like they were 'everywhere' before I took this job," Samuel Custer, Special Modes Coordinator for the Harry S Truman Memorial Veterans Administration Hospital, says. "My position is trying to find the best transportation fit for our veterans where they live and where they need services, so I checked into OATS Transit as an option for our veterans. OATS Transit fills that niche for us."

The hospital uses OATS Transit to transport veterans who live rurally or in smaller towns to dialysis appointments. Last year, over 800 trips were arranged through the Truman VA Hospital, with some veterans needing to be taken thrice weekly for their life-essential medical needs to be met.

"We are thrilled by what OATS Transit can provide, whether it's in rural areas or just being able to handle the needs of someone who uses a mobility device." Custer states, "It also helps that the services provided

are economically friendly to our budget. I always try to explain that to those who do not qualify for

their medical transportation to be paid through their veterans benefits. I always encourage them to look into OATS Transit and your affordable costs."

OATS Transit drivers undergo extensive training, including many hours of learning how to transport, secure, and assist those who use mobility devices or have medical needs. This dedication to providing high-quality service is a testament to our commitment to our veterans and riders.

"I appreciate the depth of the coverage that OATS Transit provides in the state and the ease of making arrangements for a veteran to ride." Custer explains, "The website is pretty self-explanatory. If you need a ride, look for your county, and there the schedule is. Of course, in special circumstances like dialysis or medical needs, a simple phone call and the office people really work with you to see how

best to get the service for the person in need."

OATS Transit specializes in getting people to work each day, taking patients to life-saving medical appointments, and taking people shopping so they can continue living independently. We also offer contract transportation services for agencies.


